Minutes of the POLK COUNTY AVIATION AUTHORITY ANKENY, IOWA

The Polk County Aviation Authority held a regular meeting on Thursday, June 6, 2019, at the Ankeny Regional Airport, 3737 Convenience Blvd., Ankeny, Iowa. The meeting was called to order at 5:00 P.M.

- Item 1) ROLL CALL MEMBERS PRESENT: ASHBY, GARDNER, NILLES, NOVAK MEMBERS ABSENT: BARBER, GARRISON, WANGSNESS Acting Chairperson, Todd Ashby, called the meeting to order. Present from the City of Ankeny were Airport Board Manager, Paul Moritz; Jennifer Sease, Administrative Services Director; Margaret Waldschmitt, PCAA Recording Secretary. Attorney, Amy Beattie was present. Dan Stull was present from EXEC 1. Representing McClure Engineering was Jay Pudenz.

Item 3A) "Flying Low" Corvette Club Event, Dave Vance.

Dave Vance expressed appreciation on behalf of the Corvette Club for use of the airport to host their event that took place on May 25 - 27. He stated the event was well attended.

Joel Wilson, Director of the Ottumwa Airshow, stated the committee has found the task of cleaning up the Expo grounds to be a larger job than anticipated. Wilson stated they received a bid from two companies to clear the area, the most competitive bid was for \$8,000.00. Wilson asked if the Board would authorize covering this expense. Attorney, Amy Beattie, stated the PCAA funding is for aeronautical purposes and not to be used for independent events. Beattie also stated that since this item was not on this agenda, a decision could not be made at this meeting. Todd Ashby asked that they bring back a firm proposal to the July 11th meeting for the Board to review. Wilson stated that would not be soon enough. Wilson also asked that the hay farmer be contacted to harvest his crop, so the airshow volunteers can have better access to the Expo grounds. Wilson stated the airshow committee would reimburse the farmer for four bales of hay, estimating that would be the amount of crop the farmer will lose due to airshow interference.
